





Life in Christ: A Bible Study



Jill is a multi-talented musician with a wide range of skills, expertise, and experience. She is an accomplished organist, pianist, professional singer, and choral director. We are so blessed and very excited about all the gifts and graces that she brings to Main Street UMC! Jill lives in Kernersville. She will serve as organist for the 8:30 and 10:55 Services and will accompany the Chorale and the Chancel Choir on Mondays and Wednesdays! *We are so looking forward to the Fall!*



It's a wonderful feeling to be a part of our flourishing ministries at Main Street. For example, summer Bible School serving 50 children and 2 Appalachian Service Project youth mission trips were tremendously successful. These and so many other ministries require our collective financial support to occur. Our financial position has not really improved since the June newsletter was published. Regular contributions and other income through July 31st was \$568,000 versus \$601,000 actual expenses paid. The \$33,000 deficit was temporarily covered by our moderate operating reserves. In addition, we are behind on our planned mission expenses and connectional support

by over \$20,000. Through July, financial support for ministries such as The Shepherd's Center, Next Step and Samaritan Ministries, Food Bank of NW NC among others is lower than prior years. Fortunately, there's still time to catch up.

Remember that we all pledged to support Main Street with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Let's all make sure Main Street continues fulfilling our mission "To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

The Crisis Control Food Drive, with pie in the face as the reward, was a huge success. Thanks to all who took part! There's no reason to stop now! We hope you'll make a habit of making contributions to our Bin Brigade!

As you come into the new covered entrance toward the welcome desk, you will now see 3 collection bins.

1. Crisis Control 2. Booksapalooza 3. NEW! Hope Center

Please continue to donate grocery items to **Crisis Control** as you have been. We want that bin's collections to be just as robust as ever.

Don't forget to donate books to **Booksapalooza**. Adult books are traded for books for elementary school students.

The new bin is for **Hope Center**, a food and clothing pantry on Old Hollow Road that is a ministry of R3, a small church and mission organization on Kerner Road. They serve 1000 local people a month, despite being open only 4 hours a week, 9-11 Wed. and Saturday.

Here's what to put in the Hope Center bin:


- * Empty egg cartons (a farmer donates 30 dozen eggs a week but the cartons cost 50 cents each.)
- * Clothing in good shape, including shoes and baby clothes
- * Fresh produce from your garden
- * Grocery items including: Toilet paper and other paper products; Diapers, wipes and baby food; Feminine hygiene products; Breakfast cereal, peanut butter, canned meat and other non-refrigerated foods.

We believe our congregation has the generosity to keep all three of these bins brimming. Surely we can produce 30 egg cartons a week just from Main Street!

Students Awarded J. C. Grose Memorial Scholarships for 2024

Katelyn Hunter and Grayson Weavil of Main Street United Methodist Church are recipients of the J.C. Grose Memorial Scholarships for 2024. They were recognized at Main Street United Methodist Church during worship services in August.

The Scholarship, now in its thirteenth year, has awarded over \$35,000 to 53 students. Students must have completed their freshman year or more, have strong academic achievement in college, and show commitment to helping others.

Katelyn Hunter is a rising sophomore at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill majoring in Exercise and Sports Science-Sports Administration. She is the daughter of Matt and Christie Hunter.

Grayson Weavil is a rising junior at Wake Forest University majoring in Chemistry with a concentration in and a minor in Statistics. She is the daughter of Jeff and Allison Weavil and this is her second year receiving the award.

The students have been very active in youth activities and missions as well as university and community activities. Some examples are Appalachian Service Project, Pi Beta Phi Philanthropy to raise literacy in children, cheerleading and dance, National Honor Society, YMCA mentor program through Wake Women Lead, Project Pumpkin and Freedom School for underprivileged children, and St. Jude fundraising.

The Grose-Kirkman and Cornerstone classes gave support for the Scholarship Fund this year as well as memorial gifts for Ann Kirkman, longtime founder and teacher of the class. The Grose-Kirkman Sunday School Class established the scholarship fund with memorial gifts honoring class members and other funds raised by the class. A Golf Ball Sale fundraiser is currently underway.

The Scholarship Committee reviews applications and awards the scholarship. Rising sophomores, juniors, or seniors in college who are members or children of members of Main Street UMC are eligible to apply. The next scholarship application period will be announced in May 2025 and applications will be available then through the church website.

- <u>Reduce, Reuse, Recycle</u> (before buying new supplies, check to see what you have already that can be reused or repurposed)
- Green School Supplies (made from recycled or sustainable materials)
- **Explore thrift and consignment stores** (for second hand clothing or school supplies)
- **Reusable Lunch ware** (pack lunches with reusable water bottles and snack containers to reduce use of plastic)
- **Quality over Quantity** (invest in quality items that will last longer and not need to replaced)
- <u>Minimal packaging</u> (Consider products with minimal packaging when purchasing items)
- **Reduce Idling** (when weather is mild). Turn off car engine when stopped 10 seconds or more. Vehicle emissions are more concentrated near the ground, where children breathe.



Report from our KAIROS Prison Ministry Team


