Happy New Year Sisters and Brothers in Christ!



History of Christian Worship Bible Study




A 6-week video-based study called "A History of Christian Worship" will be offered on Wednesday nights starting on February 12.



Now that I've completed my term as Finance Chair, I'd like to share positive 2024 year-end financial results and want to thank everyone for stepping up to support Main Street's Ministries. Total 2024 budget income was \$1,049,000 and total expense was \$1,049,000.

With the congregation's sacrificial and generous giving this year, especially in December, we replenished our operating reserve, a major accomplishment. At one point our deficit was -\$43,000 after paying necessary expenses. Next, we fully funded actual 2024 expenses

with 2024 income. With help from an endowment fund and another special outreach fund, 100% of planned mission support was funded for local and non-local organizations such as Crisis Control, Shepherd's Center, Food Bank of NW NC, Egbe School in Africa, Kairos Prison Ministry and many others. Finally, we funded \$75,000 or almost 75% of budgeted connectional support through the Conference and our local District. As of November, we had only funded 40% of this line item.

Additionally, building fund giving was \$160,700 which funded our monthly \$12,000 payments. The current loan balance has reduced to \$1,272,880. Also, we raised over \$47,000 for Western NC Disaster support, and money for many other ministries and non-budgeted needs. Even though we had a challenging financial year, the congregation stepped up in a major way at year end, paving the way for Main Street's ministries to again be strong and successful in 2025.

In addition, Sunday School classes, Wednesday Night Dinners and individuals have donated items such as backpacks with school supplies, prepared meals, snack items, household items that every family needs, garden vegetables and other items for which I failed to keep a record. (I'll try to do better in 2025!) It is a blessing each month to see what God has sent!

Unfortunately, for us, Starbucks on Main Street has elected to donate their food to Feed America. We are thankful for the food they have donated and are also thankful their food will still be providing nourishment to those who need it.

And then we have cookies for Christmas! We had 450 bags of cookies donated for Bethany Café in December. We blessed all our in-house guests and delivery recipients with bags of cookies. Thank you to all who provided cookies.

The Bethany Café Team wants you to know how much we appreciate your support of our monthly provision of food to the Kernersville community. Thank you and we look forward to a blessed 2025!
