THE WHITE ROSEBUD on the altar in the Sanctuary is given to the Glory of God and in memory of Dan Lineberry.

DURING THE SEASON OF LENT, the church is more subdued than other times during the year. This is an expression of our penitence and re-focusing our lives on serving God. The decoration in the church is scaled back and some elements are removed, leading up to Maundy Thursday, when we strip the church of all decoration. During Lent, we remove all the brass that we can from our sanctuary and replace it with wood-en candlesticks, wicker baskets for offering, and wooden crosses. For those items that cannot be removed, we cover them in a purple cloth. This scaling back and removal of decoration during Lent and the replacing of it on Easter helps us truly celebrate in a visual way the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

THE WEDNESDAY CONNECT DINNER on <u>April 2</u> is Oven Fried Chicken (gluten-free entrée is available upon request). Dinner is served at **5:30pm**. Dining together is a great fellowship opportunity, but if you need to get your meal "to-go", then we can do that, too! We have disposable takeout containers but we encourage you to bring your own re-usable containers for "to-go" meals. Reservations can be made by: signing a reservation card and placing it in the offering plate; calling the church office at 336-993-3411; emailing Kathryn (kathryn.jenkins@mainstreetumc.org); visiting our website or clicking the link in the Thursday Connections email each week. Reservations for dining in-person or "to-go" must be made by <u>Monday at noon</u>. The suggested donation is \$6/adult, \$3/child (10 & under). We accept cash, check, or cards. *Rise and Christian Fellowship SS classes serving*.

OASIS WORSHIP SERVICE: Come to the Sanctuary at 5:00pm on Wednesdays for an intimate 30-minute service with Holy Communion and prayer led by one of our pastors, with music by Chuck Foster, and a short devotion by a member of our congregation. SPRING CEMETERY CLEAN-UP: In preparation for the Easter Sunrise Service, there will be a cemetery spring clean on Saturday, <u>April 5</u> starting at 9:00 a.m. (*Rain date will be the next Saturday, the 12th.*) Please join us with taking out all the old flower arrangements and cleaning the markers that need cleaning. The land-scaping company will handle all the mowing and trimming, we just need to spruce up the other things. Families wishing to reuse Christmas and other decorations currently there should remove them prior to that Saturday. Also please do not place Easter or spring arrangements out until after the clean-up.

CANTATA SUNDAY is <u>April 6</u>, One Service, at 10:30 am in the Sanctuary. The combined choirs and orchestra directed by Nancy Blakemore with Jill Gardner, pianist and organist, present "The Passion Song" which includes the celebration of Holy Communion. From the triumphal entry to Easter morning, this cantata focuses primarily on the events of Holy Week. It features the feast of communion, recognizes Jesus as the Lamb of God, the Passover Lamb. And ultimately it affirms the risen Christ: Worthy is the Lamb who was slain (Rev 5:12)! Make plans now to attend at 10:30 am on Sunday, April 6, and invite your family, friends, and neighbors!
