"When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." A second time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, "Follow me."— John 21:15-19 (NRSV)

This interchange between Jesus and Peter after the resurrection is the third time Jesus appeared to the disciples. It's redeeming that Jesus gives Peter three times to affirm his love for him contrasting the three times that Peter denied Jesus. It's not only a resurrection for Jesus, it's a "resurrection" for Peter! He goes from denying that he even knew Jesus to a bold witness and indeed, the head of the fledgling church, taking the witness for Jesus all the way to Rome. All this is possible because of Jesus Christ's life-changing redemption and gift of the Holy Spirit.

Did you know that each day we are given is a mini-resurrection, a new beginning in our journey with Christ? Just as Christ's grace was sufficient for Peter, it is sufficient for you and me as well. It's really the whole reason Christ came. May this assurance hold you today: No matter how we may have stumbled, how many times our actions have "denied" Jesus, Jesus continues to offer relentless and extravagant grace for us to affirm our love for him and neighbor with the simple yet life changing invitation, "Follow Me." It is his Spirit that gives us the strength to do so. May today and everyday be a resurrection day for you!

J.C. Grose Scholarship Application NOW OPEN!

The Grose-Kirkman Sunday School Class announces that applications are open to award the 14th annual J. C. Grose Memorial Scholarship. Application is available at Main Street UMC website under Ministries and Youth: https://www.mainstreetumc.org/jcgrose-scholarship/. The scholarship provides financial support to MSUMC members and children of members who are pursuing college degrees at an accredited 2 or 4 year institution of higher learning. The scholarship provides up to 1000 dollars for a student who has completed his or her freshman, sophomore, or junior years. Prior award recipients may also apply for additional years of support by reapplying each summer and maintaining an acceptable grade point average.

The deadline for J.C. Grose scholarship applications is <u>June 16, 2025</u>, 5:00 PM.

We are ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS for the Frank & Mary Palmer Scholarship

The Frank and Mary Palmer Scholarship provides financial support to MSUMC members and children of members who are pursuing college degrees at an accredited 2 or 4 year institution of higher learning. The scholarship will provide up to \$1000 dollars for students who are rising sophomores, juniors and seniors. Previous scholarship award winners must wait 24 months before applying for the award again. The student can be awarded the Palmer scholarship along with another Main Street scholarship. Application is available online at mainstreetumc.org under Ministries and Youth.

Details for applicants:

- Criteria- applicant must be a member of Main St and has participated in their programs. They also must be a rising Sophomore, Junior or Senior college student with a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.
- If the scholarship criteria is not met, the scholarship will roll over to the next year.
- Scholarship amount \$1,000 for one recipient per year. At a later date, the Palmers reserve the right to increase the scholarship amount.
- Deadline for Frank & Mary Palmer Scholarship applications is June 27. Applications should be sent to the church office before that date. Applications received after June 27 will be returned.
- The scholarship will be awarded the first or second Sunday of August.

Welcome to SPRING!!

Also, when you set out your plants, don't throw away those plastic pots. You can take them to the Farmers Market where they can be recycled. Who knows, you may see that pot again.

Tip of the month: Save your coffee grounds and let them dry out. When you decide to sit outside this summer, burn them. Not only will you enjoy that nice aroma of coffee, but mosquitoes don't enjoy the aroma and will avoid it.


What is the Member Pick-Up Station?

The suggested donation is \$6.00 per adult and \$3.00 per child (10 and under). We accept cash, check, or card. A gluten-free option is available upon request.


